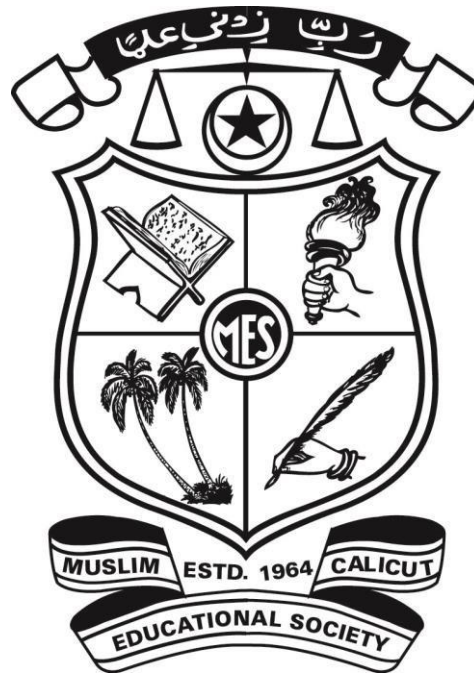

The Muslim Educational Society (Regd.), Calicut, in short MES, established in 1964, is one of the largest Educational agencies in India and is an active presence in the field of Minority welfare for the last five decades and a driving force for the remarkable transformation of the educational status of the backward communities in Kerala. The annual intake of the college is 150. The college has acquired the prestigious status of a Post Graduate Medical Institute with PG Degree Courses in General Medicine, Paediatrics, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Respiratory medicine, Psychiatry, Ophthalmology, Anaesthesiology, Dermatology, ENT, Radiology, Anatomy, Biochemistry, Microbiology, Pathology, Pharmacology and Community Medicine. We also offer DM Super specialty PG programme in the field of Neurology. The College building comprises four storeys with a total floor area of 1,50,000sq.ft. It has got full- fledged pre and para-clinical departments with fully equipped laboratories, Air conditioned Lecture Theatres & Auditorium, well set exclusive Central Library with all latest technological devices to access electronic journals and online medical and health magazines. The college has the finest infrastructure for indoor and outdoor games. All academic modules including clinical training are supervised

and administered by eminent professors and experienced faculty members. Stainless Theatre complex with 17 (seventeen) OT Units, Dialysis Department with 15 units, an Ultra modern CT Scan and a most sophisticated 1.5 Tesla MRI Machine in addition to other basic amenities are also provided in the Hospital. The Medical College has one Urban Health Centre and two Rural Health Centres, as per NMC stipulations catering to the treatment and health care requirements of the local people and training for MBBS students

The hospital beds are equipped with piped oxygen supply and the hospital has established a PSA Oxygen Plant, as per NMC/ Government of Indian norms.

INTRODUCTION

1. This prospectus relates to admission to MBBS course for the academic year 2024-25 in MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna.
2. This Prospectus contains the rules and regulations applicable for selection and admission to MBBS Course in MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna for the academic year 2024-25.
3. This Prospectus is subject to modification/addition/deletion as may be deemed necessary by the management of the MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna and will be subject to further orders, if any, passed by appropriate authorities.
4. Total number of seats available for admission to MBBS Course in accordance with this prospectus and the categories into which such admission would be made, are given in Clause III and Annexure I below

5. Duration of Courses

Duration of the Course is 4 ½ years with a Compulsory Rotating Medical Internship of 12 months. Internship training will include outreach community programmes and rotation postings of interns in the hospitals/health centers of the Muslim Educational Society.

The date of commencement of the course and the last date of completion of admission process will be as per the time schedule fixed by the Government of India/National Medical Commission /Hon'ble Court of Law.

I. CRITERIA OF ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION AND SELECTION SCHEDULE

1. Nationality:-

Candidates must be Citizens of India/children or dependents of Non-Resident Indians. The candidates should also satisfy the conditions prescribed in the Prospectus.

2. Age:

He/she shall complete the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to the MBBS Course.

3. Qualification /Academic

- a) Applicants must meet all the requirements stipulated by the NMC and Kerala University of Health Sciences for admission to MBBS course.
- b) "Candidate must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the qualifying examination as mentioned in clause(2) regulation 4 of the Graduate Medical Education Regulation, 1997 of NMC and in addition must have obtained a minimum of marks at 50th percentile in 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET UG) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) for the respective admission year for admission to MBBS/BDS courses. In respect of candidates belonging to the Scheduled castes, Scheduled Tribes category the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together in qualifying examination be 40% instead of 50% and minimum marks obtained in 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET UG) shall be at 40th percentile instead of 50th percentile.

- c) The eligibility criteria for admission to NRI category will be as per GO(MS)No.34/2013/H&FWD dated 05.02.2013, G.O(Ms)No.243/2014/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014, G.O.(Rt)No.1556/2024/H&FWD dt.28-06-2024 and Notification No. CEE/152/2024-TA1 dated 26-03-2024 of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Government of Kerala and further orders in this regard, if any, issued by government from time to time

Note:

- i. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from authorities other than the State of Kerala shall produce the certificate of recognition and equivalency of the qualifying examination from the Kerala University of Health Sciences.
- ii. Candidates should possess certificate of good conduct and character issued from the institution last studied.

1. Reservation

- a) MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna is a Muslim minority institution conferred by National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions, Government of India under section 2(g) of the National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions Act 2004. Hence 75 seats under management quota (ie. 50% of the total seats) are reserved for candidates belonging to the Muslim Community. The number of seats proposed to be reserved under various heads is detailed in Annexure I. Candidates claiming reservation should invariably produce community certificate obtained from the Revenue authorities concerned. If sufficient candidates are not available for seats reserved for management community, candidates from general category will be considered.

5. Schedule of Selection and Admission

Schedule of Selection and Admission will be as fixed by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Government of Kerala based on the time schedule fixed by the appropriate competent authorities concerned in this regard.

(Note: with regard to the CRITERIA OF ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION AND SELECTION SCHEDULE, you are instructed to visit the website of NMC (www.nmc.org.in) and KEAM (www.cee.kerala.gov.in) regularly for updates).

II. HOW TO APPLY

The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi, Government of India, as per letter dated 10-03-2017 directed the respective state government to conduct Common counseling for admission to UG and PG courses in all medical education institution in their respective state including private medical colleges/Deemed Universities. Hence application for admission to MBBS course in the college shall be submitted online to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Government of Kerala, the authority designated by the State Government to conduct counseling for allotment of students, through their official website www.cee.kerala.gov.in.

III. Fee Structure

The fees shown above are previous year fee and are subject to revision by the Fee Regulatory Committee for Medical Education in Kerala/appropriate government authorities concerned/Hon'ble Courts of law.

** Number of seats proposed to be reserved under various heads is detailed in Annexure I.*

Note:

- Tuition fee for the first year shall be paid at the time of admission.
- Besides tuition fees, fees prescribed by the University/other statutory bodies (like exam fee, registration fee, etc.), caution deposit, Hostel & Mess fees & refundable deposit and other fees as may be required (Uniform Fee/Books, Stationery, etc.) shall be paid in addition by the students in actual from time to time.
- The Annual Tuition Fee is fixed for the entire course period taking into the account of the existing amount of stipend being given to the interns. Hence, the amount of stipend will be provided at the rate prevailing at the time of joining by the candidate and shall be applicable for the entire course period. In case, enhancement of amount of stipend, if any, is necessitated, the Tuition fee will be subject to revision proportionally.

IV. PROCEDURE OF SELECTION

Total seats available for MBBS course in the MES Medical College, Perinthalmanna including NRI quota seats will be filled up by the college as allotted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE) from the list of eligible candidates who have qualified in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET UG-2024) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) for admission to MBBS/BDS course, through common counseling conducted by the CEE as per letter dated 10-03-2017 of the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi.

1. Preparation of common Merit list and Allotment of Seats

Rank list will be prepared by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE) from among the applicant candidates who have qualified in the National Eligibility- cum-Entrance Test (NEET UG 2024) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA)

for admission to MBBS/BDS course, based on the NEET rank secured by them in the above examination after observing inter-se merit.

2. Publication of rank list and Allotment of Candidates: Rank list of candidates as detailed in clause 4.1 above will be prepared and published by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations and allotment will be done strictly on the basis of inter-se merit from the rank list so prepared. There shall usually be four rounds (including mop-up and stray vacancy rounds) of Common Counselling by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations.

3.

The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall furnish the list of the students to be admitted in MES Medical College and the college shall admit the students specified in the list. The students in the list will be given specific instructions as to the date and time of presentation before the college for admission, documents to be submitted, and the amount of fees to be remitted at the time of admission. The detailed institutional requirement shall be published in the website of the institution from time to time.

As per the Direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the interim Judgment dated 09/05/17 in WP(C) No. 267/2017 filed by DAR-US-SLAM EDUCATIONAL TRUST AND ORS Vs Medical Council of India AND ORS., the seats that are still remaining vacant after the counseling by the State Government shall be filled as follows.

“In order to ascertain the number of seats that still remain vacant after the counselling the State Government or the authority designated by the State Government shall conduct mop-up counselling for allotment of students. After the completion counseling, the State Government shall determine the number of seats that are still vacant and thereafter shall forward a list of students in order of merit, equaling to ten times the number of vacant seats to the medical college so that in case of any stray vacancy arising in any college, the said seat may be filled up from the said list.”

So, the MES Medical College shall be entitled to fill those seats still remaining vacant after the counselling by the State Government from the list forwarded by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations as per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the interim Judgment dated 09/05/17 in WP(C) No. 267/2017 filed by DAR- US-SLAM EDUCATIONAL TRUST AND ORS Vs Medical Council of India AND ORS. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations/Government shall not have any claim over such seats after the counselling by the State Government and the forfeited seats shall not be brought forward to succeeding year for compensation.

4. The Management will have the right to decline admission to any candidate on genuine grounds. In such cases, the reasons for the same will be recorded and communicated to the candidate concerned, immediately.

5. Furnishing of false information:

Furnishing of false information/particulars would result in the forfeiture of the candidature as well as cancellation of admission to the course, if admitted, and in addition, will attract the relevant provisions of criminal law of the land.

V. ADMISSION

1. The Managements will have the right to deny admission to any applicant on genuine grounds. In such cases, the reasons for the same will be recorded and communicated to the student concerned.
2. Candidates who get allotment shall appear before the Dean of the College and take admission at the appointed time and date in the college and remit tuition fee, admission fee and special fees for the first year. They shall also produce the following documents in original at the time of admission before the

Dean of the College:

- (a) Admit card of NEET UG-2024.
- (b) Result/Score Card of NEET UG-2024.
- (c) Mark list at the qualifying examination.
- (d) Pass Certificate of the candidate at the qualifying examination.
- (e) Document (School Record viz: SSLC or equivalent) of the candidate to prove his/ her date of birth.
- (f) Eligibility/equivalency certificate obtained from the Kerala University of Health Sciences by candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from authorities other than the State of Kerala / CBSE /ISCE.
- (g) Course and conduct certificate from the institution last attended.
- (h) Transfer certificate (TC) from the institution last attended.
- (i) Community certificate issued by competent authority (if applicable).
- (j) Minority certificate issued by competent authority (if applicable).
- (k) Non-creamy Layer certificate issued by competent authority (if applicable)
- (l) Income certificate issued by the competent authority (if applicable).
- (m) Originals of other certificates, the copies of which are enclosed with the application form.
- (n) Document/ certificate required in proof of any benefit claimed in the application form.
- (o) TWO sets of photocopies of all the above documents
- (p) Passport size colour photo -10nos.
- (q) A Physical Fitness Certificate in the format given in **Annexure III** obtained from a Medical Officer in Government Service not below the rank of Assistant Medical Officer.
- (r) Undertaking in **Annexure II** to be duly notarized in the stamp paper worth of 500/- rupees.

- (s) Service Bond in the **Annexure V** to be duly notarized in the stamp paper worth of 500/- rupees
- (t) Any other document/ certificate required to be produced.

For NRI Quota, the following additional documents are to be submitted:

- a) **Passport copy and Visa** attested by the Embassy/Green Card/*Norka Roots ID*/Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) documents of their respective sponsors. The job of the sponsor should be mentioned in any of the above documents. The validity of the Visa should be up to the closing date of admission for Medical course.
- b) **Employment certificate:** Employment certificate of the sponsor attested by the Embassy/Consulate authorities (In case, the employment of the sponsor is not mentioned in the documents such as Passport copy and Visa attested by the Embassy/Green Card/Overseas Citizen of India(OCI)).
- c) **Relationship Certificate:** Relationship certificate of the sponsor and student to be issued by the revenue authorities (Relationship should be established) as per the G.O (Ms) No. 243/14/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014. If the sponsor is the Father/Mother of the applicant, educational certificates of the applicant containing the name of the sponsor shall also be accepted.
- d) **Notarized Sworn Affidavit:** The sworn affidavit from the Sponsor in stamp paper worth Rs. 500/- should be produced. The same shall also be notarized by the Notary Public, disclosing that the student is dependent of the sponsor and all the expenses i.e. tuition fee and special fee and hostel fee of the candidate for the entire course period will be borne by the Sponsor.

In case the sponsor is abroad, the sponsor has to submit the sworn affidavit notarized by the Notary Public/Consulate/Embassy as per the rules and regulations prevailing in the respective countries, where the sponsor is presently working, disclosing that the student is dependent of the sponsor and that all expenses i.e. tuition fee, hostel fee and special fee, of the candidate for the entire course period will be borne by the Sponsor

Note: All the certificates/documents required to establish NRI Status/ Non-creamy Layer/Minority etc. shall be produced at the time of submission of application itself. The certificate produced later shall not be entertained under any circumstances.

Candidates will not be given any extension of time to produce the original documents/certificates.

Definition of the term "Dependent" under NRI Quota: “An Applicant who depends upon his/her Father/ Mother/Brothers & Sisters (inclusive of first cousins)/Husband/Wife/Brothers and Sisters (inclusive of first cousins) of father or mother/Half Brother/Half Sister/Adopted father or adopted mother working abroad”

3. Cancellation of admission/Refund of Fees

- i. No request for refund of fees received within a period of five days prior to the date of closure of admission to the MBBS course fixed by the National Medical Commission/any competent authority appointed by the Govt. of India/Hon'ble Supreme Court of India will be entertained. Refund of fees will be applicable only to students who leave the College on or before the above-referred date. The refund will be made within thirty days of the receipt of request thereof.
- ii. If any candidate discontinues the course or leaves the Institution within a period of five days before the closing of admission in the 1st year or discontinues the course/leaves the institution in the subsequent years, he/she is liable to pay the fees for the remaining years i.e. fees for the whole course. In such cases the documents in original submitted by the candidate at the time of admission and other documents like Transfer Certificate in original to be issued by the college will be released only after payment of all dues including the fees for the remaining years.
- iii. In addition to the above, such students will have to pay hostel, mess and other fees proportionately for the period they remained on the rolls of the college. For the purpose of calculations of proportionate recovery, part of a month will be considered as a full month.

4. Ragging

Important : According to the Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1998, 'ragging' means doing of any act by disorderly conduct to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or shame or embarrassment to that student and includes teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or to perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course be willing to do.

All institutions will have to abide by the directives of the Honorable Supreme Court of India, dated May 16, 2007 in SLP No.(s) 24295 of 2006 University of Kerala Vs Council, Principal's, College, Kerala & Ors [with SLP (C) No.24296-99/2004 & W.P.(CrI) No.173/2006 & SLP (C) No.14356/2005] and the recommendations approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India for effective prevention of ragging in educational institutions.

In case, the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/ she indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/ she shall be expelled from the educational institution.

Each of the student of the institution and his/ her parents, or guardian are required to submit a combined undertaking at the time of registration/ admission in prescribed format available in **Annexure IV** which is mandatory for registration/ admission.

Such an undertaking shall be submitted before the commencement of every academic year. An undertaking similar to the above shall be submitted every year by the student who is admitted to the hostel.

VI. DISCIPLINE

1. Rules and regulations as prescribed should be strictly followed at the college, hospital and hostels.

2. Smoking and consumption of alcoholic drinks are totally prohibited.
3. Hostel accommodation is provided for on year, renewable after assessment of the discipline of the student on a yearly basis.
4. Daily biometric punching is mandatory in the hostel students, failing to comply with regulations will forfeit their hostel accommodation.
5. **Uniform & Dress Code:** Students are expected to obey the dress code of the College. Jeans, Baggies, T-Shirts and the likes are not permitted to be worn inside the hospital/College campus. A uniform is prescribed for the students of MBBS in the College and the students have to strictly wear the uniform during class hours and clinical postings. The uniform dress material supply and stitching will be done by the college, the cost of which should be borne by the students.
6. All the male students are expected to wear formal pants, shirts and shoes. The female students are expected to wear saree and blouse with sleeves / loose fitting churidar with sleeves. They should also wear shawl. Face veil is not permitted in the class rooms and during clinical work as well as inside the college campus and hostels. All the students should wear overcoat and ID card compulsorily. ***All students shall ensure modesty in dressing in the Campus. Students are not allowed to attend the classes/clinical postings wearing garments which fully cover their face.*** The management reserves the right to take appropriate disciplinary action against those who do not comply with the college dress code (vide judgment of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in W.P.(C).No.35293 of 2018 dated 04-12-2018).
7. There will be regular value oriented classes/discussions in the campus. Students are advised to participate in these programmes. This is an institution meant for higher learning and its objective is not only to impart education but also to build the character of the students and transform them into better human beings.
8. Students are expected to observe absolute discipline in their conduct, dignity and decorum during the entire period they spend in the institution. Failure to observe absolute discipline, dignity and decorum will invite appropriate disciplinary action.
9. Ragging is strictly prohibited. If it is found during the admission or any time there after that the applicant has indulged in ragging admission shall be refused or the student shall be expelled from the institution. Whoever commits, participate in, abets or propagate ragging within or outside the institution shall be suspended from the institution with immediate effect and the Dean/Principal shall report the matter to the civil/police authorities.

VII. SERVICE BOND

All candidate shall undergo one year service as Resident Medical Officer/Junior Resident in MES Medical College or allied institutions of the Muslim Educational Society as may be required by the Management and for that they shall execute a bond to that effect along with their parents/guardian inter alia containing an unconditional undertaking that in the event of failure to undergo one year service with the M.E.S Medical College as Junior Residents/Tutors/Medical Officers as the case may be ; they shall pay a sum of Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten lakhs only) as liquidated damages to the college and further that the college will be entitled to retain all original certificates of the candidate submitted at the time of admission and other documents to be issued by the College on completion of the course till the said one year service is completed with the College or the said amount is paid to the College.

VIII. GENERAL

- a) No TA or other allowance will be paid for any purpose connected with Selection and Admission.
- b) All candidates who are selected for admission should get themselves vaccinated against Hepatitis A and B before admission. A certificate to this effect will have to be produced at the time of admission/before commencement of the course.
